Q: How to use Windows 10 recovery function?

A: Before you start please note:

- Backup all your personal files and programs.
- Keep the AC adapter plugged during the whole recovery process.
- Do NOT modify (move or delete) any system files or clean the system disk.

Here is the step by step to access Windows 10 recovery function:

- I. Click Windows icon in the lower-left corner of the desktop.
- II. Click "Settings"
- III. Click "Update & Security"
- IV. Click "Recovery"
- V. In Recovery tab, you can choose what kind of recovery method you want to do. If the running Windows 10 was upgraded from Windows 7/8/8.1 and you want to go back to the original OS, please refer to <u>Table 1: Go back to Windows 7/8.1</u> or otherwise, please go to <u>Table 2: Reset Windows 10</u>.

P.S. Besides **"Reset this PC,"** you will find one of the options **"Go back to Windows 7/8.1"** or **"Restore to factory state"** depending on what you've chosen to keep when upgrading Windows 10.

^{*1}: **"Go back to Windows 7/8.1"**: This option would disappear if it has been over 31 days since you upgraded to Windows 10.

*2: "Restore to factory state" is only available on Windows 10 upgraded from MSI pre-installed Windows 8 or 8.1.

^{*1}: If you choose **"Reset"**, and you will get an updated Windows 10 if you have accessed Windows update after upgrading to Windows 10.
